












VISION STATEMENT:

IDENTIFY | SITE HISTORY LAKE COUNTRY TRAIL

- LAKE COUNTRY TRAIL FOLLOWS THE OLD MILWAUKEE-WATERTOWN INTERURBAN LINE
- RAIL LINE OPERATED BY THE MILWAUKEE ELECTRIC RAILWAY AND COMPANY
- ABANDONED IN THE EARLY 1940'S



















IDENTIFY | SITE HISTORY SAWMILLS

- PEWAUKEE'S FIRST SETTLER BUILT A SAWMILL UPON ARRIVING IN 1837
- . WOOD FROM THE SAWMILL WAS USED FOR THE TOWN'S FIRST SCHOOL BUILDING





















IDENTIFY | SITE HISTORY ICE HARVESTING

- THE ICE HARVESTING INDUSTRY WAS A LARGE PART OF PEWAUKEE'S HISTORY
- OVER 1/2 MILLION TONS OF ICE DISTRIBUTED EACH YEAR FROM PEWAUKEE LAKE
- . BREWERIES AND THE MEAT PACKING INDUSTRY WERE THE PRIMARY USERS OF THE ICE



















IDENTIFY | SITE HISTORY

LOCAL TRADE + CRAFT

- ROLLING TERRAIN AND FERTILE SOIL WERE PRIMARY REASON FOR SETTLEMENT
- LARGE AGRICULTURE COMMUNITY
- EARLY BUSINESSES INCLUDED A BLACKSMITH SHOP AND A WAGON MANUFACTURING FACILITY.
